

Frauke Seehusen received her license to practice as a veterinarian in 2003 after she finished her studies in veterinary medicine at the University of Veterinary Medicine in Hannover, Germany. After participation in the residency programme at the Department of Pathology in Hannover and finalisation of her doctoral thesis (titled: "Investigations upon axonopathies and the role of the neurotrophin BDNF in canine distemper encephalitis"), she passed the board examination of the European College of Veterinary Pathologists (ECVP) in 2009. In the same year, she became also a German specialist for Veterinary Pathology. In 2017, she completed her habilitation thesis (titled: "Investigations upon the pathogenesis of axonal damage and remyelination in encephalitides and genetic defects of the central nervous system"). Since the same year, she is working as a senior pathologist and scientific department manager at the Institute of Veterinary Pathology at the Vetsuisse Faculty at the University of Zurich in Switzerland. Her main research areas are neuropathology, pathogenesis of infectious diseases, especially in farm animals, and forensic pathology.
